1. THE TEXT ITSELF

The Servant of the Lord.

- His Call (verses 1-3)
- His Discouragement (verse 4a)
- His Greater Call to the Nations (verses 4b-6)

Isaiah 49: 1b-3

^{1a} Listen to me, you islands; hear this, you distant nations ... Isaiah 49:1a

^{1b} ... Before I was born the Lord called me; from my mother's womb he has spoken my name.

² He made my mouth like a sharpened sword, in the shadow of his hand he hid me; he made me into a polished arrow and concealed me in his quiver.

³ He said to me, "You are my servant, Israel, in whom I will display my splendor."

^{4a} But I said, "I have labored in vain, I have spent my strength for nothing ..." Isaiah 49:4a

- ^{4b} "Yet what is due me is in the Lord's hand, and my reward is with my God."
- ⁵ And now the Lord says— he who formed me in the womb to be his servant to bring Jacob back to him and gather Israel to himself, for I am honored in the eyes of the Lord and my God has been my strength—
- ⁶ he says: "It is too small a thing for you to be my servant to restore the tribes of Jacob and bring back those of Israel I have kept. I will also make you a light for the Gentiles, that my salvation may reach to the ends of the earth."

Isaiah 49:4b-6

2. HOW DOES THIS TEXT APPLY TO ISRAEL?

Israel was called to be a light to the nations but failed.

3. HOW DOES THIS TEXT APPLY TO JESUS?

Jesus is the True Israel, the True Servant of the Lord; THE Light to the Nations!

Christ is shown to be the Light to the Nations by:

- His birth
- His ministry
- His message
- His passion
- His commission to us

Luke 2:29-32a

²⁹ Sovereign Lord, as you have promised, you now dismiss your servant in peace.

³⁰ For my eyes have seen your salvation,

³¹ which you have prepared in the sight of all people,

³² a light for revelation to the Gentiles ...

¹⁶ After this I will return and rebuild David's fallen tent. Its ruins I will rebuild, and I will restore it,

¹⁷ that the remnant of men may seek the Lord, and all the Gentiles who bear my name... Acts 15:16-17a


IV. HOW DOES THIS TEXT APPLY TO US, THE BODY OF CHRIST?
