a. His Wrath

**Galatians 3:13 (ESV)**

*<sup>13</sup> Christ redeemed us from the curse of the law by becoming a curse for us—for it is written, “Cursed is everyone who is hanged on a tree.”*

b. His Mercy

**John 10:18 (ESV)**

*No one takes it from me, but I lay it down of my own accord. I have authority to lay it down, and I have authority to take it up again. This charge I have received from my Father.*

**Ephesians 2:1-3 (ESV)**

*1 And you were dead in the trespasses and sins 2 in which you once walked, following the course of this world, following the prince of the power of the air, the spirit that is now at work in the sons of disobedience— 3 among whom we all once lived in the passions of our flesh, carrying out the desires of the body and the mind, and were by nature children of wrath, like the rest of mankind*

### 3. What it Accomplished

#### a. The Atonement

"In short, the means of atonement is substitution: Christ died in our place for our sins... The Messiah took on all the consequences of our rebellion so that we can experience all the blessings of his kingdom. This is the great exchange:

- He died so that we can live.
- He was cursed so that we can be blessed.
- He was wounded so that we can be healed.
- He went into exile so that we can be at home.
- He was crushed so that we can be made whole.
- He carried our guilt so that we can be forgiven.
- He bore our shame so that we can receive honor.
- He experienced defeat so that we can have victory.
- He was condemned so that we can be declared innocent.
- He took our moral stains so that we can be washed clean.
- He was plunged into darkness so that we can walk in the light."
