What is The Gospel?

The most important question that is discussed in the membership conversation is the question, "What is the gospel?" Whether you understand the answer to that question or not, it's usually a question that many of us have a hard time expressing in words. It's our hope to help in your understanding and experience of the gospel, as well as, your ability to articulate to others who may ask you, "What is the gospel?"

The original Greek for the word "Gospel" means "Good News." Probably the simplest and easiest way to define the "Good News" (i.e. Gospel) is, "God doing for us what we could never do for ourselves."

Below are a few quotes and verses that may be helpful in understanding and explaining the Gospel (i.e. Good News).

The Gospel (Good News) in 5 Words:

CREATION - God made it all.

FALL - We lost it all.

REDEMPTION - Jesus did it all.

RESTORATION - We get it all.

CONSUMATION - Jesus will restore it all.

G.R.A.C.E.

Another way to answer the question, "What is the Gospel?" is by using the acronym G.R.A.C.E which stands for **God's Riches At Christ's Expense.** The essence of the Gospel is that salvation comes from God. While it is our responsibility to believe by faith the finished work of Jesus on our behalf (in His life, death, and resurrection), it's God's grace that gives us the faith to believe. Salvation is, from start to finish, a gift of God's amazing grace. So, the gospel can be explained in a simple and easy way by using the acronym G.R.A.C.E., which is:

God made him (Jesus) who knew no sin to be sin for us, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God. – 2 Corinthians 5:21

For you know the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, that though he was rich, yet for your sake he became poor, so that you through his poverty might become rich. – 2 Corinthians 8:9

At one time we too were foolish, disobedient, deceived and enslaved by all kinds of passions and pleasures. We lived in malice and envy, being hated and hating one another. But when the kindness and love of God our Savior appeared, he saved us, not because of righteous things we had done, but because of his mercy. He saved us through the washing of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit, whom he poured out on us generously through Jesus Christ our Savior. - Titus 3:3-6

"We who are Jews by birth and not sinful Gentiles know that a person is not justified by the works of the law, but by faith in Jesus Christ. So we, too, have put our faith in Christ Jesus that we may be justified by faith in Christ and not by the works of the law, because by the works of the law no one will be justified.

¹ Therefore, there is now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus, ² because through Christ Jesus the law of the Spirit who gives life has set you free from the law of sin and death. ³ For what the law was powerless to do because it was weakened by the flesh, God did by sending his own Son in the likeness of sinful flesh to be a sin offering. And so he condemned sin in the flesh, ⁴ in order that the righteous requirement of the law might be fully met in us, who do not live according to the flesh but according to the Spirit. – Romans 8:1-4

This is how God showed his love among us: He sent his one and only Son into the world that we might live through him. This is love: not that we loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son as an atoning sacrifice for our sins. -1 John 4:9-10

If you died today and stood before the throne of God, and He were to ask you, "Why should I let you into heaven?", you could answer that question without even uttering one word. We are saved by grace alone, through faith alone, in Christ alone, for God's glory alone.
