Below are a few ideas of specific ways to put your S.H.A.P.E. into action.
(Spiritual Gifts – Heart – Abilities – Personality – Experiences)

- Basic Needs (food, clothing, shelter, transportation)
Cooking (food, meals for individual families and/or groups)
Disabilities (serving and spending time and energy with disabled persons)
Discipling (children, students, adults, senior adults, etc.)
Drives (diapers for new moms, food for families in need, coats & blankets for the homeless, etc.)
Encouragement (by sending cards, making yourself available, etc.)
Greeting & Welcoming (at Perimeter, new neighbors in your neighborhood, etc.)
Home Repair Projects
Landscaping, Gardening & Yard Work
Neighborhood and Community (focusing on building relationships and making a Kingdom impact where you live)
Planning events (i.e. game nights, picnic, birthday parties, etc.)
Hosting events (i.e. Connect Group gatherings, baby shower for single moms, coffee social for neighbors, etc.)
Mentoring (students, single moms, engaged couples, newlyweds, refugees, etc.)
Music & Art (singing, playing an instrument, painting, drawing, etc.)
Project Management (worship services, special events, etc.)
Reading (to K-1st grade students, to elderly assisted living residents, etc.)
Teaching (Bible study, Computer literacy, Financial Basics, etc.)
Tutoring (students, refugees, internationals, etc.)
Welcome & Gift Baskets (building baskets to be given to people in need of hope, love, connection, and encouragement.
